

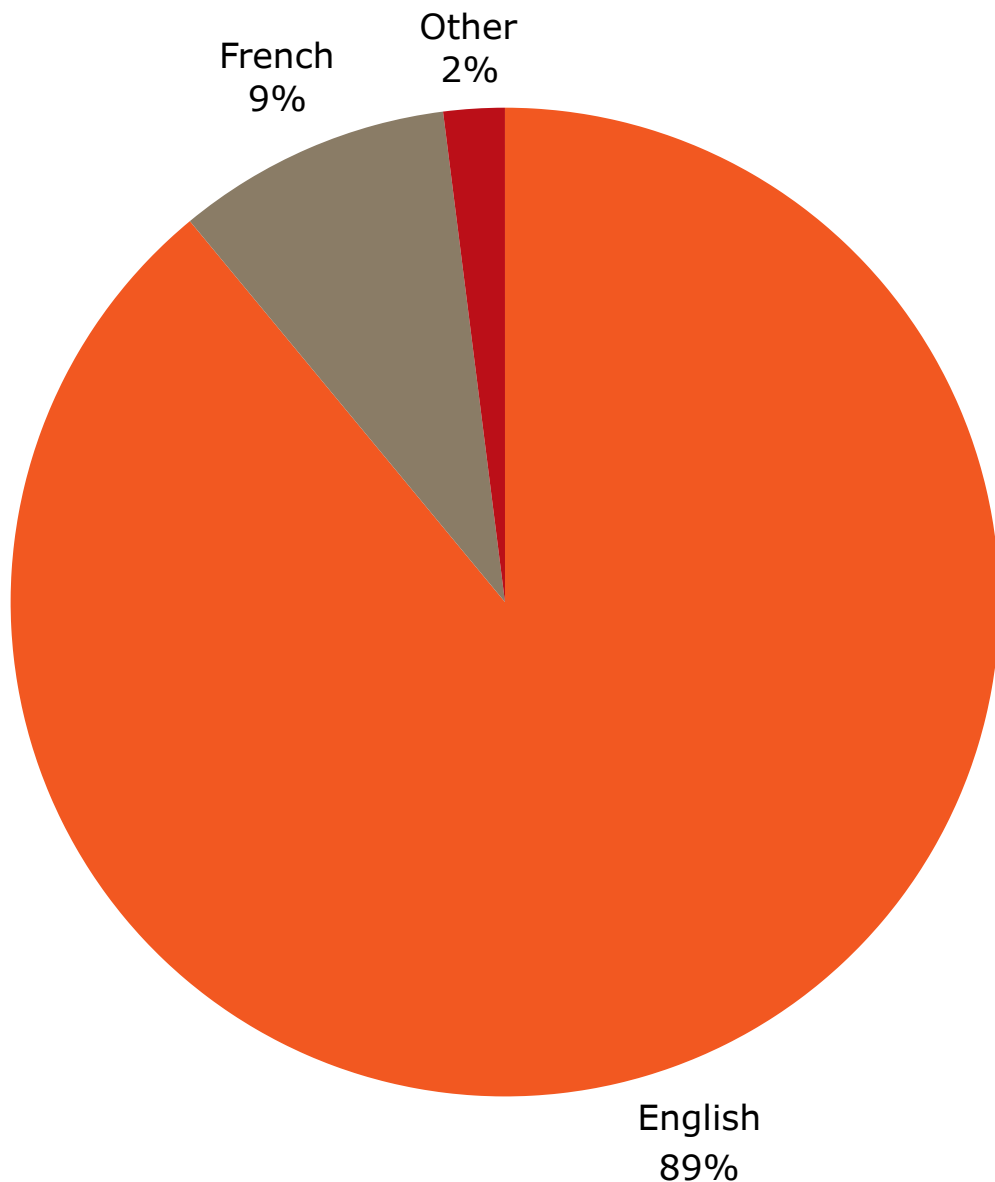
# Appendix A: Participant Demographics

Participants were invited to share information about themselves, including their primary language, ethnicity, location, and more, to help us better understand who was represented at the Summit.

## *About the Language Demographics of Participants*

Eighty-nine percent (89%) of respondents spoke English as their primary language; nine percent (9%) of respondents spoke French as their primary language, and the remainder spoke Chinese or Polish (**Figure 1**).

**Figure 1. Attendee's primary language (n = 99)**

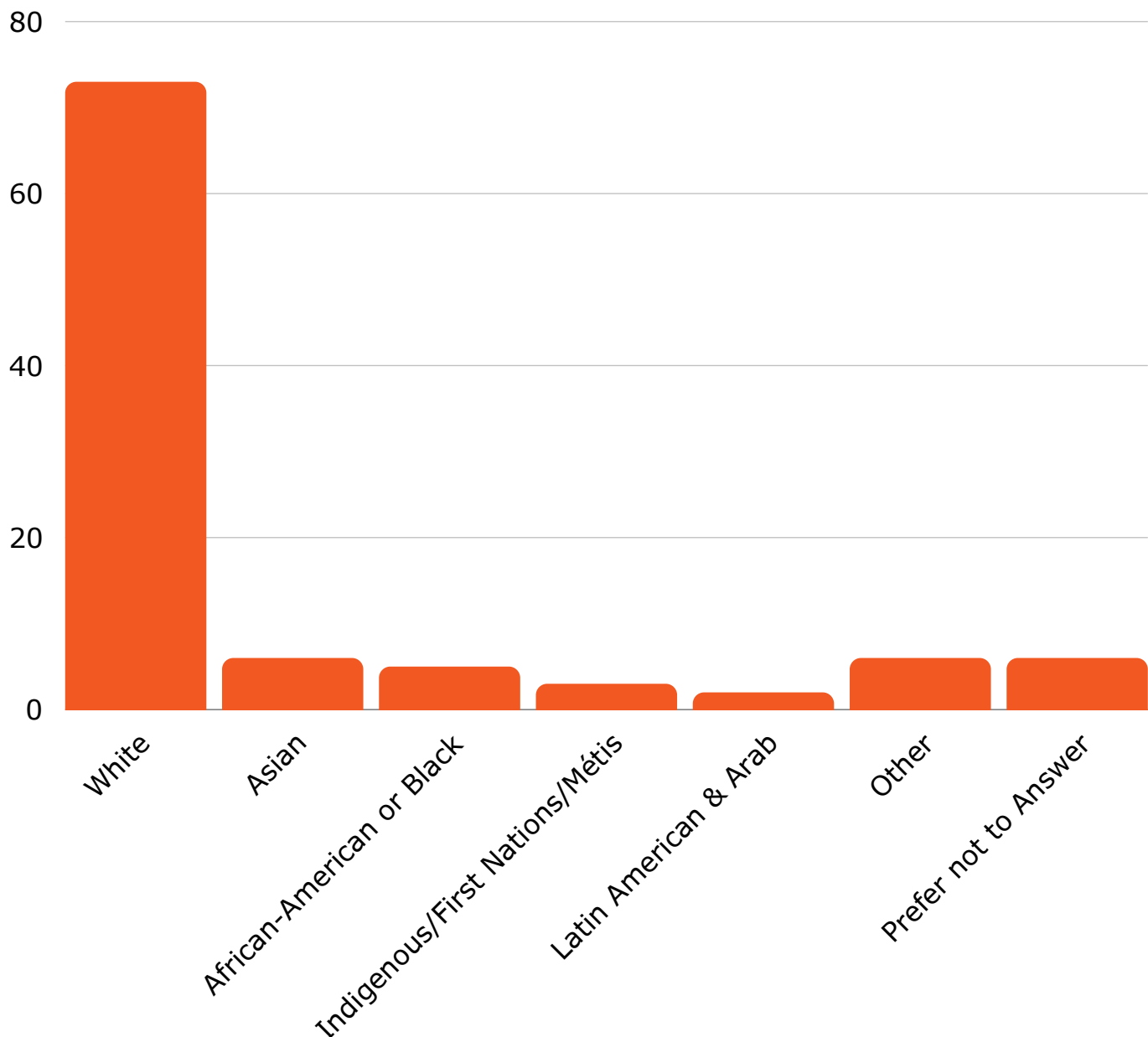


## About Participants' Ethnic Backgrounds and Geographical Locations

### Ethnicity

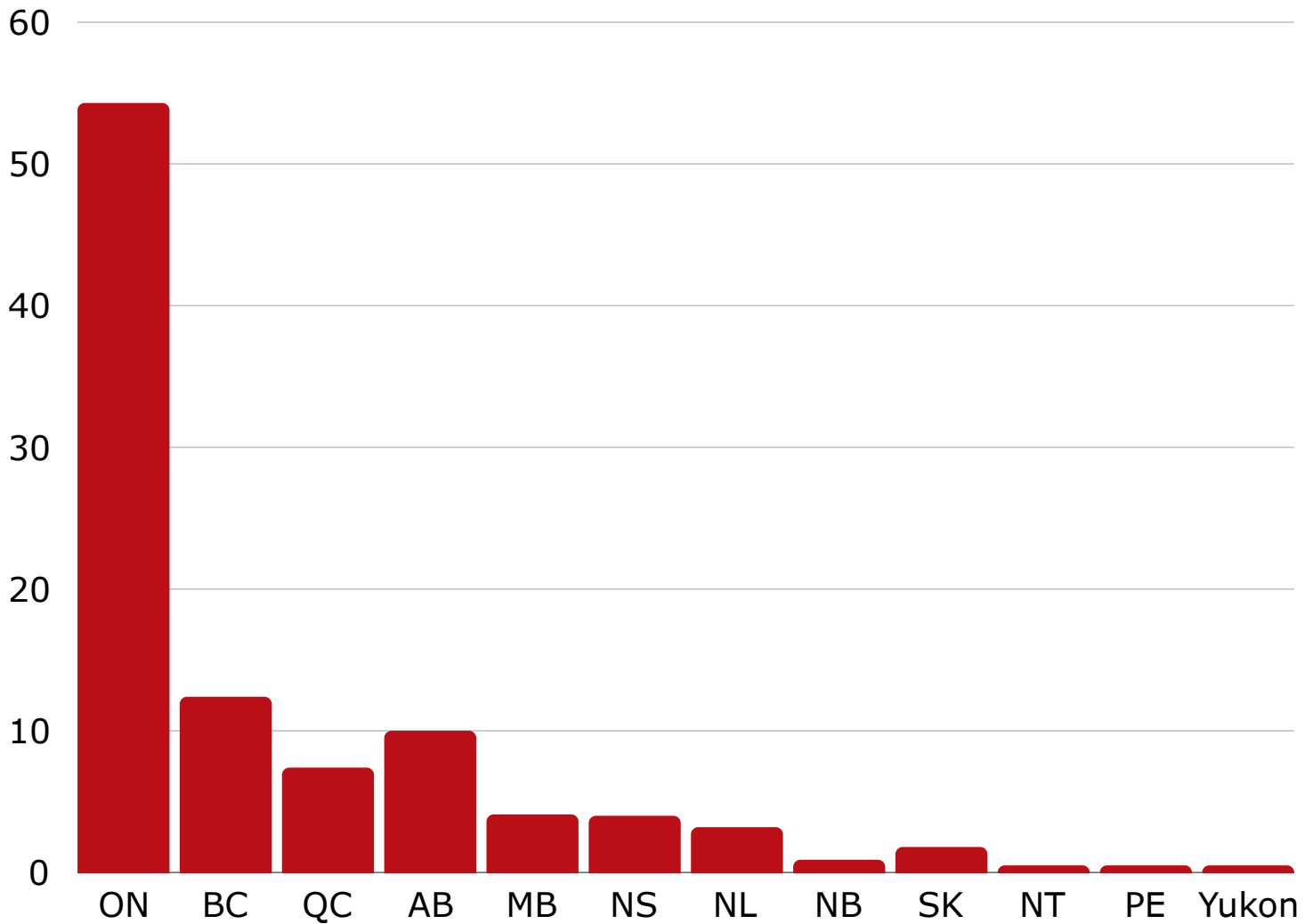
**Figure 2. Attendees' ethnicity (n = 99)**

Seventy-three percent (73%) of respondents self-identified as White; six percent (6%) of respondents identified as Asian; five percent (5%) of participants identified as Black or African-American); three percent (3%) of respondents identified as Indigenous, First Nations, or Métis; two percent (2%) of participants identified as Latin American and Arab; six percent (6%) of respondents identified as 'Other,' and six percent (6%) of respondents preferred not to answer (**Figure 2**).

Location

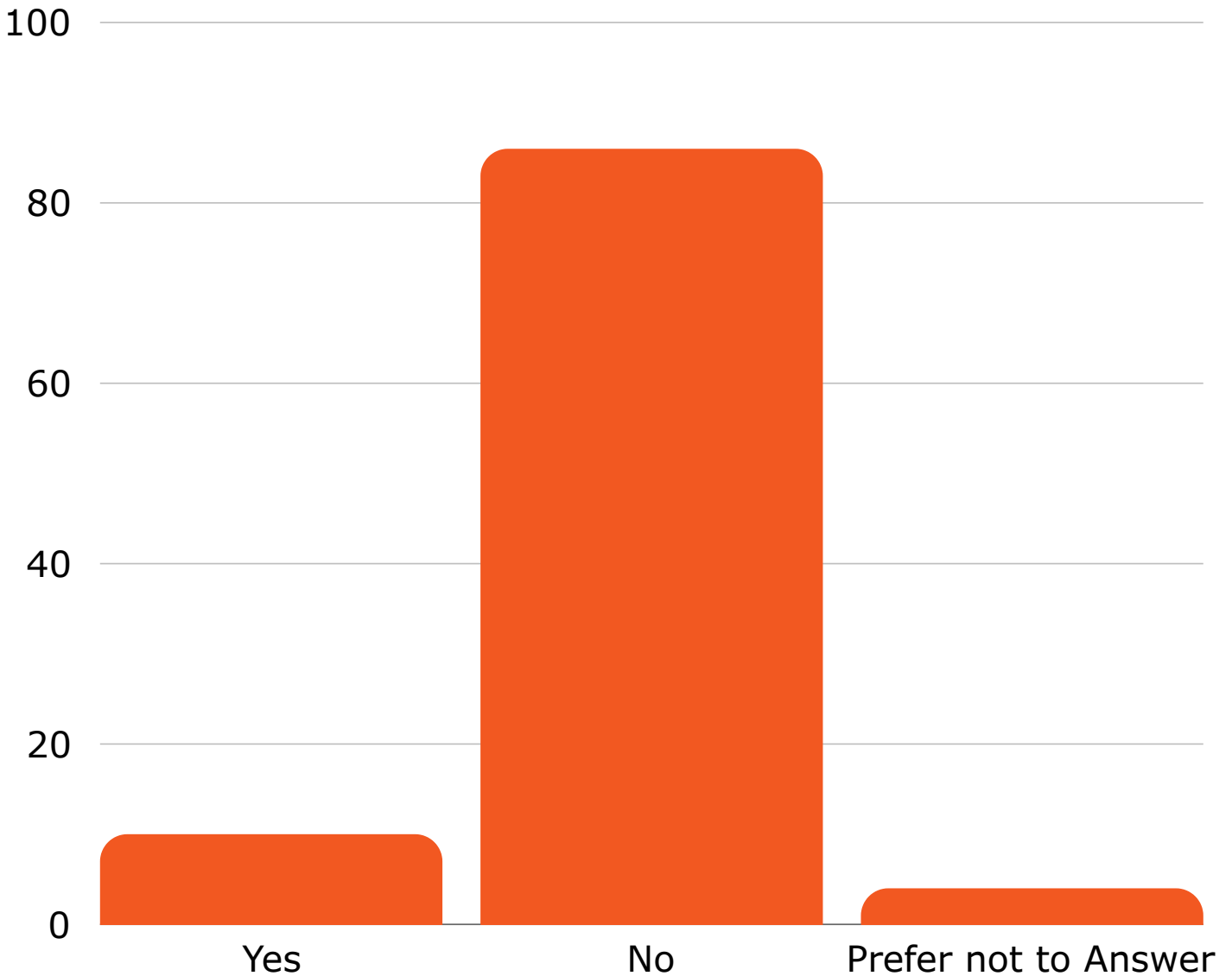
**Figure 3. Participants' location by province (n = 216)**

Over half of respondents (54%) were from Ontario; twelve percent (12%) of respondents were from British Columbia; ten percent (10%) of respondents were from Alberta; seven percent (7%) of respondents were from Quebec; Manitoba and Nova Scotia each represented four percent (4%) of respondents, respectively; three percent (3%) of respondents were from Newfoundland and Labrador, and Saskatchewan represented two percent (2%) of all respondents. New Brunswick, the Northwest Territories, Prince Edward Island, Nunavut, and the Yukon each represented 1% of all respondents (**Figure 3**).

About Participants' Identities as Persons with Disabilities or Other Chronic Conditions

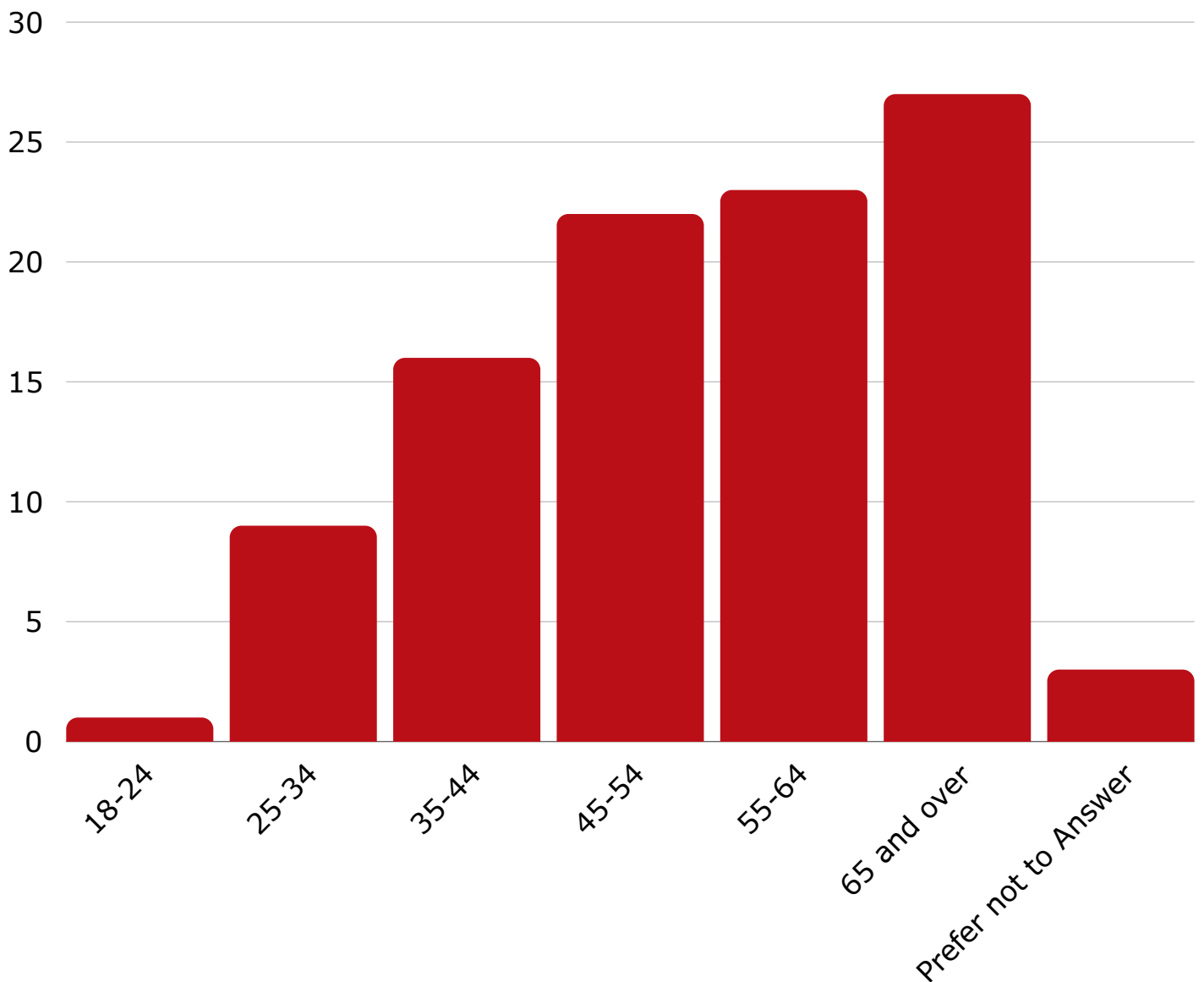
**Figure 4. Attendees with a disability or other chronic condition (n = 99)**

Ten percent (10%) of respondents self-identified as having a disability or other chronic condition; eighty-six percent of respondents (86%) said no, and four percent (4%) of respondents preferred not to answer (**Figure 4**).

About Participants' Ages

Twenty-seven percent (27%) of respondents were over the age of 65; twenty-three percent (23%) of respondents were between the ages of 55 and 64; twenty-two percent (22%) of respondents were between the ages of 45 and 54; sixteen percent (16%) of respondents were between the ages of 35 and 44; nine percent of respondents were between the ages of 25 and 34; one percent (1%) of respondents were between the ages of 18 and 24, and three percent (3%) of respondents preferred not to answer **(Figure 5)**.

About Participants' Gender Identities

Eighty-three percent (83%) of respondents identified as female; thirteen percent (13%) of respondents identified as male; one percent (1%) of respondents identified as non-binary, third gender, or two-spirit, and four percent (4%) of respondents preferred not to answer (**Figure 6**).
